Vote-Solar RFQ

Commissioner Hanley made a motion to enter into negotiations with Power Management Company, LLC of Sagamore Beach, MA to implement a comprehensive Solar Photovoltaic system and management program. Chairman Pallotta will conduct the negotiations on behalf of the board. Chairman Pallotta seconded.

Registry of Deeds employees were invited by the Commissioners to comment at this time. Richard Connelly questioned why a temporary employee was being extended for 60 days if there was a hiring freeze in place? Chairman Pallotta explained the maintenance department employees are reimbursed through court rent. Cari Poudrier and Anna Messner both questioned the date the lay-offs would be in effect? Chairman Pallotta will extend the date to April 1st to enable all employees affected by the lay-offs to retain insurance for the month of April.
